This enables our customers to telegraph orders with little expense. Some code words describe both the kind of goods and the size of package. In such case you would refer to this table for the code word for the amount or quantity wanted.

THE USE OF BRUSHES

(FROM THE WESTERN PAINTER, CHICAGO)

Too much cannot be said in regard to the use and care of brushes. We have seen many persons who were good painters, but who did not seem to understand anything about taking care of their tools.

Cold, dry winters are especially severe on brushes, which are usually kept in buildings that are heated by steam, furnaces or other dry heat. A brush should never be condemned because it contains a few loose hairs. A good and careful workman will get these out before he puts his brush into use. A little thoughtfulness on the part of foremen in shops will save a large amount of trouble, and many a brush that is hastily condemned would prove a good one.




Swelling a new brush is a very important item in the future usefulness of that tool. Under no circumstances should a new brush (paint or varnish, round or oval) be put in water to swell with the bristles down, for water-soaked bristles will always work flabby, and if the bristles are of a fine quality, they will nearly always twist. The handles are usually driven into round and oval brushes. As

the wood and bristles both shrink when the brushes are kept in a warm, dry place, it is advisable to swell these brushes before using them. Be careful, though, to put your brushes in the water with the handle down, as shown in the accompanying illustration, letting the water come just to the point where the bristles emerge from the binding. This will swell the handle without soaking the elasticity out of the bristles and without making them flabby.

Keep brushes in a cool or damp spot, and as near the floor as possible. Exposures to heat will sometimes cause the wood to shrink and the best brush to shed bristles.

WHITEWASH BRUSHES should never be put in hot or newly slacked lime, or lime with acids in it, as this burns the bristle and causes it to lose its vitality, and makes the ends break off.

Dealers should acquaint their customers with these facts, and when complaints are made, inquire whether the above directions have been observed.




Fig. 1. Showing rolled-up mode of using pads on panels, etc.






Fig. A. PULLEY FOR POWER MILL-lection

- r. That as the sponge grows in water and is used wet, it should be offered for sale wet. Sponges when dry are hard, rough and easily torn; when wet, are soft and elastic and much less easily torn. The difference between fruit and fish, glue and gelatine in dried and soaked state applies to sponges. It can be therefore readily conceived that it is to the interest of the dealer to offer the sponges for sale wet.
- 2. Please note: The strongest sponge is easily torn by pulling across the grain. The fair test is with the grain. Everything has a grain. Wooden columns support buildings because with or along the grain, but wood across the grain can be easily broken.

GLASS

PLATE GLASS

When and how "Glass" came to be discovered and manufactured we do not know. It was in use to some extent in Egypt two thousand years before the Christian Era; but for how much longer a period does not perhaps concern us.

The subject of immediate interest to us is "Plate Glass," and we know its history, for it dates back only a little over two hundred years.

It is to France that we are indebted for the crystal show-windows that ornament our thoroughfares, for the splendid mirrors that reflect the faces and forms of our beautiful women, and for the plate glass that shields our loved ones from the inclemency of the weather, and adds so much to the attractiveness and beauty of our homes.

THE MAKING OF PLATE GLASS

We have often been asked, How is plate glass made, and what is it made of?

Answering these questions briefly, we have to say, first, that it is made of sand, soda, and lime, fused at a very high temperature into a double silicate which is called glass.

To answer how it is made we cannot do better than to give the description of casting plate glass as written by Mr. M. A. Cochin:


When one enters for the first time into one of the vast plate works at night, the furnaces are closed, and the dull sound of a violent though captive fire alone interrupts the silence. From time to time a workman opens the working hole to look into the furnace at the condition of the glass; long, bluish flames then light the sides of the annealing ovens, the blackened beams, the heavy casting tables, and the mattresses on which half-naked workmen quietly sleep. Suddenly the hour strikes: the call is beaten on the iron slabs which surround the furnace. The maneuvers begin with the activity and precision of an artillery movement. The furnaces are opened, the glowing pots are seized, drawn out, and raised into the air by mechanical means; they pass like hanging globes of fire along the beams, then stop, and are lowered over the immense cast-iron table, placed with its roller before the open mouth of the annealing oven. The signal given, the pot is inclined quickly and the beautiful opal liquid, brilliant, transparent, and unctuous, falls and spreads over the table like ductile wax.

CASTING PLATE GLASS

At a second signal the roller passes over the red and paste-like glass; a workman, with his eyes fixed on the fiery substance, skims off all apparent defects with bold and skillful hand; then the roller falls and passes off.

ROLLING PLATE GLASS

And now wenty workmen, provided with suitable tools, quickly push the glass into the oven, where it is annealed by slowly cooling. The workmen then return the emptied pot to the furnace and begin again, without disorder, without noise, without rest, until all the pots of the furnace have been cast. The pots are refilled, the furnace reclosed, darkness again falls, and the continuous noise of the fire preparing fresh work is again the only sound heard.



STORING THE HOT-ROLLED PLATE


The process of taking it out of the ovens is less dramatic than the casting. And yet it is striking to see twelve workmen, with no other help than leather straps, raise and carry this large, thin, and fragile glass upon its edge, walking in step, like drilled soldiers, from the annealing ovens to the racks, where it is now ready for the next process—the grinding and smoothing.



The glass is now rough and opaque, and must undergo the different processes of grinding and smoothing to bring the surfaces to a perfect plane, and give it that satin-like finish that is so necessary to its successful polishing. The grinding is done by the use of successive grades of sand, beginning with the very coarsest, and following grade by grade down to the very finest grain. The smoothing is then completed by following, in a similar manner, with emery, carefully graded.

GRINDING THE ROUGH PLATE GLASS


The glass is still opaque and must be polished to make it transparent. The polishing is one of the most delicate processes in the manufacture, for, as it has to transmit or reflect light, there must be no defect in it to disperse or obscure the rays.



POLISHING THE GROUND AND SMOOTH PLATE GLASS

By this mechanical work the glass loses at least one-third of its weight. A glass works producing a million square feet of finished plate glass annually would make about six million pounds of rough plate, and this, when finished, would only weigh three million five hundred thousand pounds, showing a loss in actual glass of two million five hundred thousand pounds, which passes off in the debris to the river.

When we add to this the fact that about one-half of the weight of the lime and soda originally used to produce this glass, released by heat, escapes into the atmosphere in the shape of carbonic and sulphuric acid, one may get some idea of the vast waste of material and the consequent cost of converting such homely substances as sand, soda and limestone into so beautiful an article as plate glass.



And now a word as to the general idea of the costliness of plate glass. Only a few years ago it was looked upon as a great luxury in which none but the wealthiest could indulge. But now the point has been reached where it has become a necessity; where anyone who is able to build a home, however humble, can well afford to use plate glass for its windows. Nothing so adorns the beauty of a home nor gives so great delight to its possessor, or adds so much to its value, at so slight a cost, as plate glass.

It is our natural desire to interest you in plate glass; to point out its merits and its beauty.

EXAMINING THE FINISHED PLATE FOR DEFECTS AND CUTTING PLATE GLASS

ONE WAY

is to use common window glass, which is usually streaked, smoked, and stained, and full of minute air bubbles. Objects seen through it become deformed and distorted. When sunshine falls upon it, it has the appearance of the battered bottom of a tin pan. It never looks clean, no matter how carefully it is washed and dried.

THE OTHER WAY

is to use plate glass, which glistens like a mirror, and reflects like one. Objects seen through it are sharp and clean cut. It has no imperfections, no air bubbles, no wavy effects. There is no trouble about cleaning it, and when cleaned it keeps clean a long time.



Plate glass keeps a house warmer in winter and cooler in summer. It adds to the beauty both within and without.

We make our ventilating frames of galvanized iron, and can insert ventilators in ordinary frames or in irregular shapes.


